Seven Angels and Seven Trumpets

8:7 *The First Trumpet:* “The Land” is burned.

8:8,9 *The Second Trumpet:* “A mountain”, burning, is thrown into the sea.

8:10,11 *The Third Trumpet:* A star named *Wormwood* falls from heaven.

8:12,13 *The Fourth Trumpet:* The sun, the moon and the stars are smitten, and an eagle, flying in midheaven, cries, “*Woe, woe, woe...*”

9:1-12 *The Fifth Trumpet:* (“*The first woe*”) A “fallen star” produces an “army of locusts” that torments the unsealed men for five months.
